*These figures reflect an overall average of how many years it takes students who (1) entered the program with a master's degree and (2) those who did not to complete the program. Therefore, the number of years it takes someone with a master's degree to typically complete the program is lower than what the table suggests while the number of years it takes someone without a master's degree to typically complete the program is higher than what the table suggests.

*Specifically, students who enter the program without a masters deree in a psychology-related area can expect to take approximately 3 semesters longer to complete the necessary foundational coursework compared to students who enter with this coursework completed.

*Students who enter the doctoral program with previous graduate work in psychology negotiate a contract with the program faculty to waive courses that would duplicate previous coursework. Faculty review previously completed graduate coursework and relevant documents (e.g. transcripts, course descriptions, syllabi) to determine the appropriateness of using previous coursework to satisfy the curriculum.
