Due to the new Gen Ed requirement of STA 210, the previous degree requirement of STA 291 will no longer be valid for students in the program since they will be receiving statistical reasoning in Gen Ed and additional statistical methods pertaining to the program in KHP 445. The remaining credits will be made up in electives chosen with the help of an advisor, to bring the total number of earned hours up to 120. Approved electives were selected based on the intent to meet the needs of pre-professional students for graduate programs and also better prepare students for the job market within the field. Elective courses are as follows: ABT 360, BIO 150, BIO 151, (which would soon be phased into BIO 148 & BIO 155), BIO 152, BIO 153, BSC 331, CHE 230, CHE 231, CLA 131, CPH 201, CPH 365 (subtitle required: society & aging), PHI 305, PHY 213, PSY 223, and SOC 350 (subtitle required: health/medical sociology).

¹ Note that MA 109 is NOT approved as a Quantitative Foundations course. Students in a major requiring calculus will use a calculus course (MA 113, 123 or 137) while students not requiring calculus should take MA 111, PHI 120 or another approved course.




